At the mid-point of the normal election cycle, some two and a half years after being elected to represent all in the Ludlow constituency in the House of Commons, I want to account to you for what I have done as your MP.

I have tried to listen to my electorate and be as accessible as possible. This is why I have campaigned on the issues that matter locally such as saving our hospitals and our post offices. I have also set up a Mobile Surgery to take around villages as well as towns. I have held some 80 surgeries each year.

I have written letters seeking views, with residents' surveys each autumn and questionnaires to particular professions or groups on issues affecting them.

Views from constituents have informed my contributions to debates in the House of Commons. I try to be a stronger voice for Ludlow constituency and speak relatively often, "well above average" according to 'www.theyworkforyou.com'.

I have enjoyed my work in the House, spending a year on the Work & Pensions Select Committee, before joining the senior backbench Public Accounts Committee and also recently the powerful Treasury Select Committee.

I also completed my Parliamentary Service Police Scheme this spring having been on the beat for 22 days with West Mercia police.
